Buxtorf I took detailed notes on Sebastian Münster's discussion of Hebrew Abbreviations in his *Chaldaica Grammatica* (Basel, 1527), pp. 191-212 (ff. 1-9) and on his Hebrew-Latin glossary of phrases and tropes, located on pp. 159-187 (ff. 29-45). The notebook also contains annotations on the books of Job, the Psalms, Ezra, Nehemiah, and Esther (ff. 46-63), and closes with Latin translations of Hebrew phrases (ff. 71-72).

It is not related to the Yiddish translation made by Elias Schadaeus and printed under the title *Fünff Bücher des Newen Testaments* (Strasbourg, 1592) which contains the books of Luke, John, Acts, Romans, and Hebrews (Göttingen UB Sig.: 8 Bibl. II, 3255). According Dr. Abraham David of the Jewish National and University Library, Jerusalem, the handwriting indicates that it was written sometime during the sixteenth century.
